


Community-Academic Partnership Education Workshop Series Survey



Emmett Till & Mamie Till-Mobley: Let the World See February 9–May 19, 2024

This traveling exhibition shares the story of Emmett Till and the bravery of his mother, Mamie Till-Mobley, whose activism fueled the Civil Rights Movement. The artworks speak to the Till family story as well as recent events, showing that racial violence and the need for social justice continues today. 
